Black History Month– Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks was an American activist in the civil rights movement after she refused to give up her seat on a bus for a white passenger. She was born in 1913 in Alabama and died in 2005. Rosa Parks worked as a seamstress and was later arrested for rejecting a bus driver's orders. The

Alabama law stated that Black passengers had to relinquish seats to white passengers when the bus was full. Most public places were separated by race, and not obeying the law could lead to arrest. Rosa Parks's protest gave courage to thousands of people and gave us a courageous example. This sparked a boycott of buses, which eventually caused a blow to the bus company's profits due to the decrease of residents boarding. She is known as "the mother of the freedom movement."

PORT MOODY POLICE YOUTH PROGRAM

The Port Moody Police Department is hosting a FREE program for local youth currently enrolled in Grades 11 & 12. The program is designed to give youth an understanding of policing as a career and will allow students to earn volunteer credits (30 hours) they can apply towards their graduation. The program will take place out of the Port Moody Police Department headquarters located at 3051 St Johns Street.

Participants are required to attend all 8 sessions in their entirety. Each day will have a different theme and there will be demonstrations from various specialty sections including the Police Dog Service and Forensic Identification Services. There will be opportunity for participants to experience hands-on components in a training environment (for example: traffic stops scenarios, lifting fingerprints, drill, fitness).

Applicants will be required to receive parental / guardian permission. Applicants will also undergo a basic criminal record search and will require their principal's endorsement to participate. Priority will be given to youth who reside in Port Moody.
