

Reminder to all that SD43 is Scent Aware, and as such the district is asking for cooperation towards a scent reduced environment.


All staff, students and visitors are strongly encouraged to avoid or reduce the use of fragranced products, and to replace them with unscented alternatives.

- She was an American mathematician whose calculations of orbital mechanics as a NASA employee were vital to the success of the U.S. crewed spaceflights.
- Her knowledge in mathematics helped NASA to send people to the moon and bring them back safely.
- She overcome obstacles related to race and gender as well, aiding in the great advancements of humanity.
- She was born in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, on August 26, 1918.
- She was one of the first black students integrated into West Virginia's graduate schools.
- She contributed to plans for a Mars mission.
- She was given the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
