



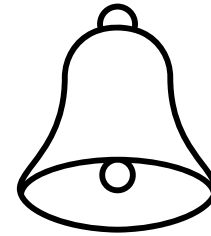

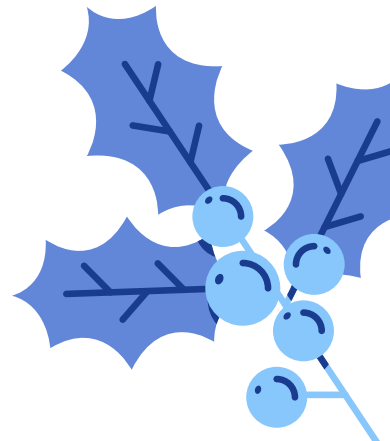
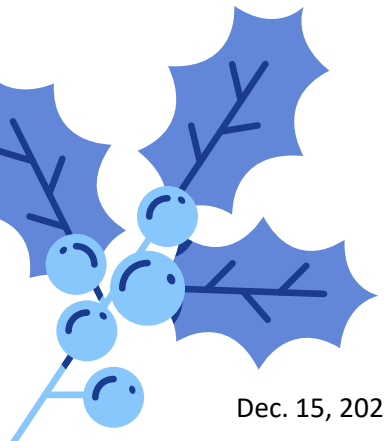

Introduction to Rebar

Local 97 will be running a high school "Introduction to Rebar" class in Maple Ridge. This 2-week bootcamp (80 hour) will teach you the basic skills to work on a reinforcing project. Week 1, will be held during Spring Break and Week 2 will be held the beginning of July. After successfully completing your second week, you will receive the required tools and be placed on a jobsite. Starting rate after finishing this class is \$29.27/hour plus vacation pay and benefits. After 6 months on the job the union will sponsor you in an apprenticeship. After completing your schooling and becoming a ticketed journeyman ironworker, you can earn up to \$45.03/hour plus vacation pay and benefits. If you are interested in getting into the trade please contact KC Newman.

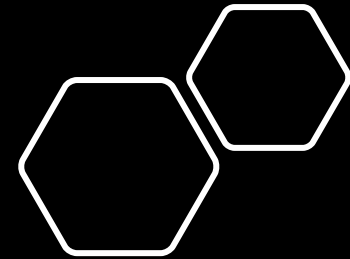

Occupational First Aid Level 1

Occupational First Aid (OFA) – Level 1

Occupational First Aid (OFA) Level 1 is a **one-day course** designed to cover all medical techniques considered to be within the responsibility of the Occupational First Aid Level 1 Attendant as required by the Workers' Compensation Board of BC (WCB).

Course information:

- time: **8.30am and runs until 4.30pm**
 - with appropriate coffee and lunch breaks... bring your own food or there is a fast-food restaurant nearby
- age: **must be at least 16 years old** at the time of the course
- advertised as \$90 (\$120 to non-members), but after district discount, cost will be \$80 + GST (**\$84 total**)... so great savings!
- location: Universal Health & Safety at **#201 - 4199 Lougheed Hwy, Burnaby**
 - 10-minute walk from Gilmore Skytrain station
- **Main topics covered include:**
 - Basic Life Support (CPR - A) -- CPR with Automated Defibrillator Training
 - Small Wound Management
 - Critical Airway, breathing and circulation interventions with C-spine management
- In order to be successful, participants must **demonstrate practical skill competency and achieve 70% on a multiple choice exam**. On successful completion of the course, participants receive a 3-year certification.
- certification: **government-issued photo ID** is required to receive a certificate (ex: driver's license, passport, NEXUS, BCID,...)
