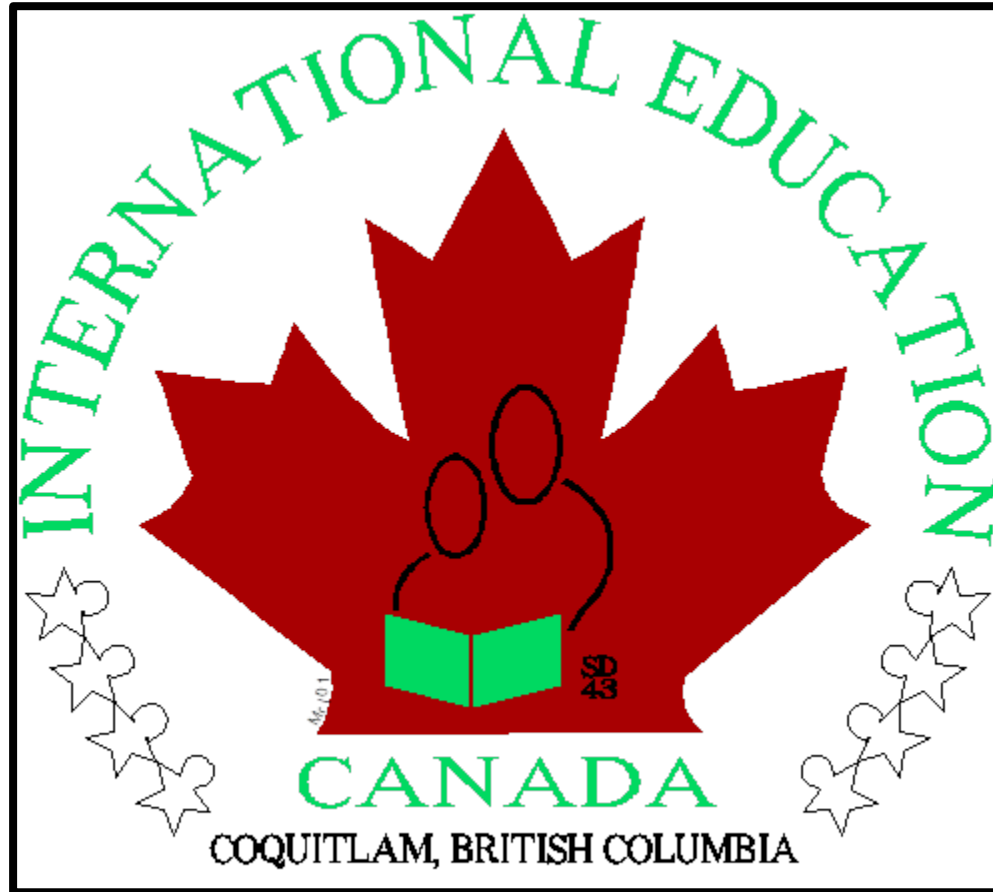

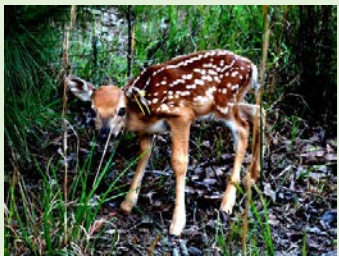

**SFU Beedie School of Business
supplemental application deadline has
been extended to **Feb. 15, 2019.****

The Beedie Luminaries Scholarship is a new scholarship for students who have faced financial adversity which may prevent them from attending post-secondary.

To be eligible for a Beedie Luminaries Scholarship, applicants must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident for at least three years
- Reside in the Lower Mainland
- Be in Grade 12
- Have applied (or plan to apply) to a BC post-secondary institution or trade school for a full-time program commencing no later than September 2019 (only the selected eight institutions will be eligible in 2018/19 UBC, SFU, Capilano University, Kwantlen Polytechnic University, Langara College, Douglas College, BCIT and JIBC).
- Have a minimum overall grade average of 75% in their most recently completed school year
- Have faced financial adversity
- Use funding for a post-secondary institution, trade school or college
- Be endorsed by their school principal, a teacher or counsellor (required) and a community organization (optional). The letters of endorsement must be included with the application.

- The deadline to apply is Feb. 15, 2019. This scholarship is worth up to \$40,000 over a 4 year Bachelor's degree or \$15,000 for a 2 year college or trade diploma.
