Explorations

Term 4 Explorations wraps up on Friday, May 3rd. Students' final term of Explorations begins Monday, May 6th which rounds out the 5-term rotation of Art, Music, Digital Arts, Tech Ed, and Foods. We hope students have enjoyed getting to *explore* all that *Explorations* has to offer at Minnekhada!

In **Art** the kiln is running full blast as grade 6/7 classes have finished glazing their clay slab mugs and await the finished project. During this time they continue working on their own designs for their Alphabet project and will be wrapping up the term with the Art History Project. The grade 8 artists are putting the finishing touches on their main project, their plaster masks.

In **Music** this term, all students played the drum set patterns from "Natural" and "It's Time" by Imagine Dragons, as well as learning the guitar chords and the playing on "Natural." Currently, we continue with the chords and performance of "It's Time" and the term will finish with learning a passing game, as well percussion and mallet parts for a song called "Sansa Kroma" from Ghana.

In **Digital Arts**, the students are currently creating their own animations using Adobe Animate. For the final project they will learn how to edit photos using Photoshop.

The grade 6/7 classes in **Tech Ed** are worked on an Egg Zip project where they protect an egg when it hits a wall after travelling down a zip line, and a cantilever where students create a structure that is clamped at one end designed to hold as much weight as possible. The grade 8 classes worked on creating a robotic arm where students need to move an object 30cm using hydraulics with syringes. For all grades, students create a project of their own design as their main project.

In **Foods**, we are going to be ending off our term with our "junk food cheat week" where the kids will make homemade ice cream sandwiches and then take part in our Master Chef competition finale! They will also have their final nutrition test.
