# **Counsellor's Corner**

Hello. I am Ms. Grandinetti and I am the counsellor at Minnekhada Middle School. Along with Mrs. Green, Minnekhada's youth worker and Ms. Kyle, SFU Master of Education Counselling Practicum Student we are looking forward to working with as many Minnekhada Middle students as possible throughout the year.

Our school counselling program provides consulting, coordinating, counselling and educational services to students, parents, teachers and administrators. These services focus on the social, emotional and developmental aspects of childhood and adolescence; services also include response to crisis, parent and staff consultation and teacher in-service.

Parents often call when they would like to talk regarding an issue involving their child or if they would like the counsellor to see their child. Parents seeking information for outside assistance in dealing with crises can call the school and we can help find appropriate agencies.

At the moment we have several counselling groups up and running which parents may feel would be appropriate for their children. The groups include both discussion and a variety of activities to make the experience both educational and fun. The groups will meet once per week for 45 minutes to develop strategies and life skills centered on the group themes below. At this point we will be offering these groups to Minnekhada students centered on the following themes:

- Dealing with Stress and Anger Ms. Kyle
- Social Responsibility/Relationship Skills for Boys Mr. J. Gould and Ms. Grandinetti
- Social /Relationship Skills for Girls Gr. 8 Ms. Grandinetti and Mrs. Greene
- Social /Relationship Skills for Girls Gr. 6/7 Ms. Kyle and Mrs. Greene
