## Applicants must be:

- Internationally trained human service professionals with documented credentials and experience in positions such as: Early Childhood educator, Mental Health worker, Home Health Care worker, Child & Youth Care worker, Counsellor, Community Advocate
- A Tri-Cities resident who is either a Permanent Resident or a Canadian citizen
- > Have an assessed intermediate level of the English language and previous training in the human services field.

- > Bridge internationally acquired training in the human service sector into the Canadian labour market
- Increase your awareness of business culture in the professional human services workplace and workplace etiquette
- > Develop an understanding of idiomatic and workplace language in a professional
- Increase your theoretical knowledge of the Canadian human services field
- Develop Canadian work experience in your field
