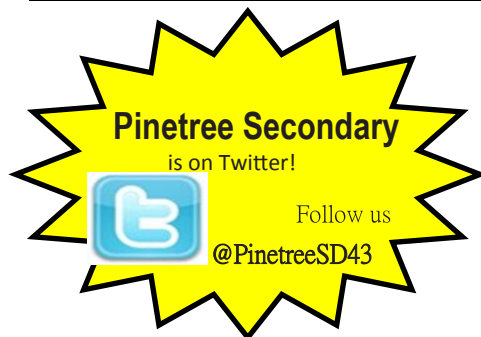

## **GRADUATION EXPECTATIONS AND UPDATES**



Graduation is getting closer. The graduating class of 2018 is excitedly awaiting their Dinner and Dance celebration and the formal Commencement ceremonies.

Throughout the year we have talked with our grade 12 students about expectations. Recently we reminded all of our grade 12 students to finish the school year on a positive note. We ask parents for their support in continuing to encourage their children to persevere and maintain their focus through until the end of the school year. Students must be passing their courses in order to attend graduation activities and many students have post-secondary admissions and scholarships contingent on their final grades.

We remind our grade 12 students and parents that all the Graduation events are school events and all school expectations around drugs, alcohol, tobacco products and vaping apply. Students who attend these events in possession of or having consumed these substances will be sent home. Our objective is to provide a safe environment for your children. We ask that parents help us by reminding their children that the graduation activities are enjoyable and memorable and that drug and alcohol consumption is not permitted.

Later this week we will be sending home a letter from the School District about policy regarding grad pranks. We have been fortunate at Pinetree that our students have been very respectful of our school community. We would like this tradition to continue. Any students who vandalize the school negatively impact the learning environment. Students involved in any grad pranks will forfeit their graduation events. Furthermore any vandalism to the school will be reported to the police for investigation and criminal prosecution. Please discuss with your children the impact these actions could have on their graduation, their future and their family.

### **Grad Cap & Gown Pickup**

On Tuesday, June 19, there will be a Grad assembly in the Gym for all Grade 12 students attending Commencement. At the end of the assembly all students that are crossing the stage at the Commencement will pick up their Cap & Gown. More information will be given to students closer to the date.

## **COURSE CHANGES**

*With the Supreme Court of Canada decision pertaining to the teachers collective agreement and class size and composition in BC schools we have had to adjust how we schedule students. We have always asked students and parents to make informed choices when choosing courses. Now this is even more important **because** as a school we have less flexibility to make changes to individual student schedules as we work to be compliant with the Supreme Court decision. Pinetree will have around 1550 students for next school year. We have already in April confirmed with students the choices they had made. We are planning on Wednesday June 13<sup>th</sup> to hand out a preview to all returning students their 2018-2019 schedule. This schedule may still change as we work to balance classes and we hire new staff. - *Need a different course for university entrance*
- *Given a course that wasn't requested*
- *Have enrolled in a summer school course*

*We will **not** make course changes for any of the following reasons:*

- *Wanting a class in a different block*
- *Wanting a different elective teacher*
- *Wanting a different teacher*
- *Wanting a class with a friend*
- *Wanting a study block at a different time*

## Cuba Music trip

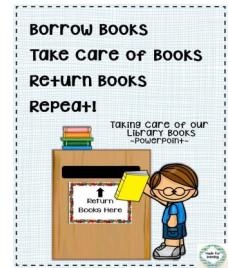
