# Early French Program (Kindergarten Entry) For the 2018 – 2019 School Year

#### CORE FRENCH

From Grades 5 to 8, all students in B.C. are required to have second language instruction. Core French is taught in every one of our elementary and middle schools. These courses help students communicate in French and experience francophone culture.

#### WHAT IS EARLY FRENCH IMMERSION?

- Early French Immersion is a program of choice offered by School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) at the Kindergarten to Grade 12 level for the 2018/2019 school year.
- Confirmation of which elementary schools will be offering the program will be posted online in advance of the information meeting.
- The Early French Immersion Program offers all students whose first language is not French the possibility of completing the prescribed B.C. curriculum and learn French at the same time.
- From Kindergarten to the end of Grade 2, all instruction is in French with English Language Arts beginning in Grade 4.
- Students also expand their cultural horizons and the program helps prepare students for the global economy.

# **Kindergarten Registration**

# For the 2018 – 2019 School Year

#### WHEN CAN MY CHILD START KINDERGARTEN?

Children who are five years old on or before December 31, 2018 may enter school in September 2018. You may defer your child's enrolment until September 2019.

#### WHEN SHOULD I REGISTER MY CHILD?

Kindergarten registration (except for Programs of Choice - Montessori, Mandarin Bilingual, Reggio and French Immersion) within School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) will be held from **February 5 to 7, 2018** in all elementary schools. If you are interested in registering your child in one of our Programs of Choice, visit <u>www.sd43.bc.ca/programs</u> for more information on application deadlines and parent information meeting locations.

All students must be registered for Kindergarten at their catchment area school. To determine your catchment school, use the <u>School Locator</u> on our website. If parents wish their child to attend an out-of-catchment school, they will be provided the opportunity to apply for a cross catchment transfer **beginning on February 8, 2018** with a **deadline of February 15, 2018** (visit our website for more information). Note: All Kindergarten students must be registered for Kindergarten at their catchment school before completing a Cross Catchment Application. If enrolment projections show that space is available, cross catchment transfer applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities: (i) catchment area child; (ii) non-catchment area child; and (iii) non-school district child.

**Kindergarten students who have a sibling at a school outside their catchment** will be accepted at the sibling's school (provided the sibling will still be in attendance the following school year) and are requested to register at the sibling's school. Therefore parents do not need to fill out a cross catchment application verifying sibling status.

**Can I use my childcare facility address to determine my child's school attendance area?** No. According to the School Act, enrolment can only be based on the home address.

Children with specific medical conditions that place them at high risk of disease should receive an additional dose at 6 months of age. See HealthLinkBC File # <u>62a</u> for more information or speak to your health care provider.

- \* A second dose is needed 4 weeks after the first dose if receiving vaccine for the first time.
- Hepatitis A vaccine is offered to Aboriginal children living both on-reserve and off-reserve.

Children who had chickenpox or shingles disease, diagnosed by a health care provider, at 1 year of age or older do not need the chickenpox vaccine and should get the MMR vaccine at 4 years of age.

# **Cross Catchment Application Process**

# For the 2018 – 2019 School Year

Parents can apply for a school outside of their neighbourhood catchment school. Should you want to choose a school other than your neighbourhood catchment school, you must be registered at your catchment school and then submit a "Cross Catchment Application" as outlined below. Approval of applications is based on availability of space and facilities.

All Kindergarten students must be registered for Kindergarten at their catchment school on February 5, 6 or 7 before completing a Cross Catchment Application, except those students with siblings at the requested school (please see below).

Grade 1-12 students, who have a sibling at a school outside their catchment, will be accepted at the sibling's school (provided the sibling will be in attendance when the student begins at the out-of-catchment school). Parents still need to complete the cross catchment application confirming sibling status.

Kindergarten students who have a sibling at a school outside their catchment will be accepted at the sibling's school (provided the sibling will still be in attendance the following school year) and are requested to register at the sibling's school. Therefore parents do not need to fill out a cross catchment application verifying sibling status. The exception to this is for a **Program of Choice**. Parents must complete the online Kindergarten programs of choice application to attend a program with their sibling. #### FEATURES OF THE 2018-2019 CROSS CATCHMENT PROCESS

- There are two separate applications: (1) Kindergarten Cross Catchment; (2) Grades 1-12 Cross Catchment (including a section to confirm sibling status)
- Applications will be accepted starting February 8 at 9 a.m. and close February 15 at 4:30 p.m.
- The district is encouraging use of the electronic version of the application form accessed through the district website (www.sd43.bc.ca) beginning February 8 at 9 a.m.
- The <u>School Locator</u> tool on the district web site provides a student's designated catchment area schools. **Catchment is based on permanent** home address.
  - o Paper forms will also be available at all schools as of February 8 at 9 a.m.
  - All completed paper applications must be returned in person or by mail to the school district office at 550 Poirier Street, Coquitlam V3J 6A7 by the closing date. Faxed or emailed copies will not be accepted.
  - The application requires student or PEN number (can be obtained from your child's school), child's birth date, home address, name of current or assigned school, and the name of the requested school. Kindergarten requests do not need to provide the student number/PEN number.
- Process details:
  - Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a first come-first served basis (in-district priority then out-of-district).
  - Approval of a cross catchment application is only applicable to the designated school requested by the student and assigned by the district.
  - Changing levels from elementary to middle, or middle to secondary school, outside of the student's assigned catchment school requires a cross catchment application and approval.
  - $\circ\;$  The system will automatically mark the time the district receives the application for the online process.
  - o The receptionist will mark the date/time of all paper copies as they are received at the front desk at the district office.
  - o The district will enter the paper applications into the online system and record the appropriate date and time.
  - The process will close promptly at 4:30 p.m. on February 15.
  - The district response to applications will be communicated by email from March 5 March 9, 2018.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT SCHOOLS AT CAPACITY

A cross catchment application does not guarantee approval of the cross catchment request as many factors influence the number of cross catchment requests that each individual school can accommodate. For example, a number of schools have reached capacity and it is anticipated they will continue to be in this position for the next few years. Be aware that the district can only approve cross catchment applications up to the current and future available space in any given school and students within the catchment have priority for placement.

The following schools are anticipated to be at capacity for 2018-2019 school year:

- Elementary Schools: Aspenwood, Blakeburn, Glen, Heritage Mountain, Irvine, James Park, Mary Hill, Nestor, Panorama Heights, Riverview Park, and Walton.
- Middle Schools: Eagle Mountain, Hillcrest, Kwayhquitlum, Pitt River, Scott Creek, and Banting
- Secondary Schools: Dr. Charles Best, Heritage Woods, and Riverside.

While applications are accepted for all schools, be aware that the district can only approve cross catchment applications if space and facilities are available.

#### DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION OF ALL SCHOOL AGE STUDENTS SCHOOL FUNDING ELIGIBILITY "CHECKL

In accordance with the School Act Section 82, Ministry of Education policy, and school district AP's 300 and 302, a student is eligible for a provincially funded education if Custodial Parent(s) or Legal Guardian(s)\* meet residency requirements. Students who are ordinarily resident in BC and whose Custodial Parent or Legal Guardian\* is ordinarily resident in BC, and are enrolled in a program in School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) are eligible for Ministry funding. Please review original documents, check the appropriate boxes of the checklist, have it verified and signed by the Principal or designate, and keep a copy in the student's G4 file.


