GRADES 9/10: CEMC WATERLOO IS HOSTING AN ONLINE COMP-SCI WORKSHOP CALLED SPARCS

We are pleased to inform you that the <u>Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing (CEMC)</u> at the University of Waterloo is hosting <u>SPARCS (Virtual)</u>, an online computer science workshop for students in Grade 9 and 10. **This** workshop is designed specifically for people belonging to gender identities under-represented in computer science including women, non-binary and trans folk who are interested in learning about computer science.

We are looking for participants with an aptitude in mathematics but with little or no previous exposure to computer science.
