- If you see something unusual when you're on public transit, report it to a uniformed attendant, or text 87.77.77





Did your child have their routine vaccinations?

This year, students in grade 6 and 9 were offered routine vaccines at school immunization clinics. If your child missed receiving their vaccines, please book an appointment with their family practitioner, pharmacist, community vaccine provider or local public health unit. Routine vaccinations are free in B.C.

Not all family practitioners and pharmacies offer vaccines, so make sure to call ahead. For a list of pharmacies and community vaccine providers visit fraserhealth.ca/qetimmunized.

Make sure your child's immunization records are up-to-date
