NEW 2023 – 2024 Schulich Leader Scholarships. The Schulich Leader Scholarships are the largest and most prestigious entrance scholarships awarded to high school graduates enrolling in Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) program at 20 Canadian partner universities. Each year, 100 scholarships are awarded – 50 for engineering students valued at \$120,000 per scholarship and 50 for science, technology or math students valued at \$100,000 per scholarship. NOTE: To be awarded a Schulich Scholarship in your discipline, students must be nominated from their high school, and they must have applied to at least one of the 20 partnered institutions.
