DROP OFF & PICK UP OF STUDENTS

As we head into the final two weeks before the winter break, we would like to remind all those who drive students to school to please remember to follow the expectations set out by the school and the city of Port Moody. We have noticed several drivers making choices that impact other drivers and also the neighbours of the school. Families should only be dropping off and picking up in the drive-through lane located beside the school tennis courts. Drivers should not be dropping off or picking up on Albert Street and making illegal U-turns that slow traffic flow and block the exit from the drive through drop off. Also, drivers should not block the driveways of our neighbours in the community. We had an incident last week where a driver picking up a student blocked a driveway, and the homeowner was very frustrated as the driver refused to move. All drivers need to remember that they cannot be above the crosswalk that leads to the school this includes dropping off for early morning classes and athletic practices, and they should be using the student drop off lanes for drop off and pick up only. The Port Moody police are aware and will be watching for drivers not following the rules and creating chaos for others.



REMINDERS WHEN USING THE BUS

As Translink is back to regular levels of service, please keep the following in mind when you are taking public transit:

- Be mindful of where you are standing when the bus is coming to a stop. Moving away from the curb allows the driver to pull in safely.
- Remember that other students want to get on the bus. Pushing your way to the front of the line makes everything slower for everyone.
- With construction, the bus stop locations have changed. Check the signs or your app carefully to make sure that you're at the right bus stop.
- Other bus riders may not want to hear your conversation—keep the volume down.
- You might miss the bus, or it might be full. Another one will be along soon.
- If you see something unusual when you're on public transit, report it to a uniformed attendant, or text 87.77.77
