What to Expect At Your In-School Fitting

1. The Pre-Game (Before Your Fitting)

It's never a bad idea to come prepared! Our rental and retail collection is available online. We always suggest having a quick look online to get an idea about what sort of look you're after. The following options will be available at your school's fitting: <https://blackandlee.com>

- **Rental Packages** include everything your Grad will need for the big day. Coat, pant, shirt, vest, neckwear, jewelry, dress socks, pocket square, dress shoes. You can't beat the convenience and value of a rental! *From \$99.*
- **Suit Packages (retail)** have been created with Grads in mind. Suit Packages include coat, pant, shirt and tie. Everything is new and for your Grad to keep! *From \$299.*
- **Custom Suit Service** is available for Grads with a specific look in mind. Your Grad selects fabric, colour and style and we'll create his suit - just for him! *From \$399.*

#2. Your Fitting Event

On the day of your fitting event, we're loading up our showroom and bringing it to you. We'll be there with our full display of tuxedos and suits, catalogs, price lists, measuring tapes, formal wear style tips and anything else we might need to make your Grad fitting a memorable event. Grads and parents are welcome to pop in at any point during the scheduled time. While a fitting is generally a relatively quick process, we still recommend planning to be with us for around 20-30 minutes. Some other important points to mention:

- Try-on pieces for sizing will be available.
- No obligation to book; everyone is welcome to browse.
- In order to secure your tuxedo or suit for your event date, a 50% deposit is required at time of fitting. Point of Sale terminal available for deposit payment (accepted methods of payment: cash, debit, Visa, Mastercard or American Express).

#3. Final Fitting

There are two options for final fittings:

- Two days prior to Grad, we will drop tuxedos and suits off at your school to be distributed by your school's administration.

Or

- Two days prior to Grad, the student may pick up and try on their suit or tuxedo at your nearest Black & Lee retail store (please specify ahead of time if you would like to pick up at a store).

#4. Post Celebration 🍷
