Grade 12 students are advised to have their yearlong coursework for the Career Life Connections 12 (all students) and CAS (IB students) up to date by the end of the week.

Numeracy and Literacy Assessments: assessment session details (times and locations) will be shared and posted in January. These are required assessments for graduation.

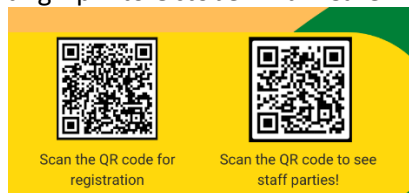

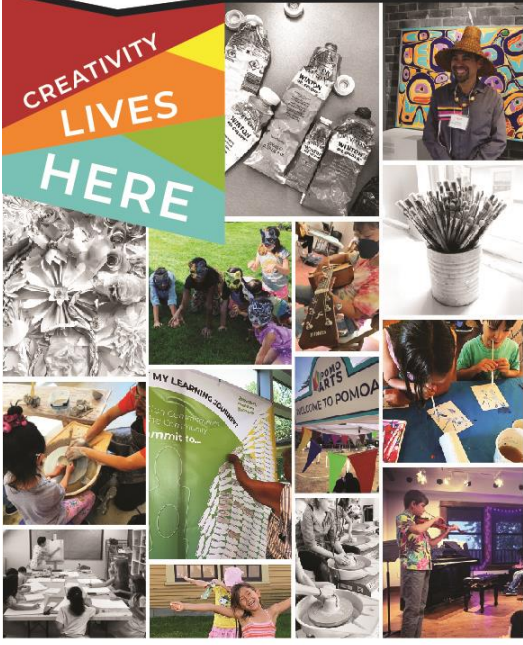
