2. Teachers' Presentation - Gardening Club Patti Henry & Leslie Hancock

- Patti and Leslie outlined the work they have done so far with Roy Stibbs students to enhance the environment around our school grounds. The big focus is on environmental awareness and hands-on involvement.
- They also expressed their future goals both short and long-term and asked for some financial and human/labour support.
- A detailed list of items was provided and the PAC was very supportive of this initiative.
- We will work with Patti and Leslie to ask our Roy Stibbs community for donations and support through our newsletter, as well as discuss PAC-led fundraising for specific items on the Gardening Club list.
- 3. Reports
- a. Treasurer's Report
 - Presenter: Paul McDonald
 - Paul outlined our year-to-date spending from the Fundraising Account which totals \$2078.76.
 - Fundraising so far has brought in \$3200 which is very good, although there was one NSF cheque for \$270 for Entertainment Books. This is still being investigated.
 - Total in the Fundraising Account is \$8645.27. According to our budget, we have only one major item left which is the Field Trip subsidy for each class (total \$1200 approx.). As a result, we have money for some new initiatives.
 - Gaming Account total is \$8126.96. The next big withdrawal from this account will be the Friendship Day activities.
 - Ms. Tipper discussed the new plan for K-Grade 2 this year which is going to Omega Gym. The cost would be higher than previous years, at a total of \$700. Grade 3-5 will still go swimming at a cost of \$400.
