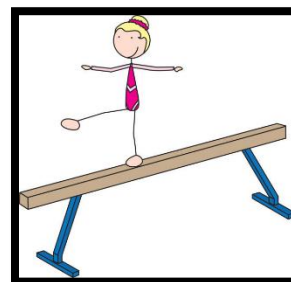

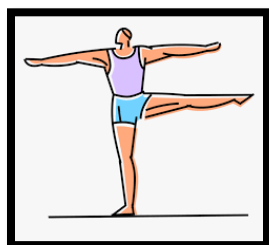

Free information sessions: How To Co-Exist Safely With Coyotes

Sign up to attend a free information session to learn how to co-exist safely with urban coyotes.

Coquitlam and Port Moody are collaborating with the Stanley Park Ecology Society for the second year to provide information on common misconceptions about urban coyotes, as well as tips to help keep your family and pets safe.

Coyote breeding season is underway now through April, which means they will be more active as they secure and protect territory. Residents may hear coyotes howling and yipping more often as they communicate with each other and establish their territories and may even come across coyotes while the animals are active and seeking mates.

Minimizing conflicts between coyotes, humans, and pets is important in protecting the safety of our community, and our urban wildlife. Coyotes have a vital role to play in the urban ecosystem as they help control the population of rodents and other wildlife.

Presented by Dezirae Barreto from the Stanley Park Ecology Society, each one-hour session will provide information about coyote breeding season, common misconceptions about



urban coyotes, what to do if you encounter a coyote, and ways to manage attractants. All ages are welcome to attend.

Portwood Phase 1 Civil Upgrades

Starting the week of February 19, the Portwood construction team will start the civil infrastructure upgrades. This means that roads around the school will be impacted as crews excavate and upgrade neighbourhood pipes for stormwater, water, sewage, and electricity needs. It is anticipated the below-grade Civil Upgrades will take approximately five months and will be tackled in phases at specific areas throughout the next few months.



- Phase 1 will commence February 20, 2024 and last approximately 4 weeks.
- Phase 1 work involves replacing the existing sanitary pipe along Angela Drive.
- Excavated areas will be protected by fencing.
- Work will take place on the south side of Angela and involve excavation of the existing road.
- Excavations will occur in sections and will be backfilled at the end of each work day.

- Vehicular traffic will be reduced to single lane (north side) alternating traffic with traffic control personnel on each end of the work zone.
- The sidewalk on the south side of Angela will remain open for pedestrians.
- Traffic control personnel will be stationed at the intersection of Angela and Cecile Drive to assist pedestrians.

During this Phase 1 work, it will be necessary to close access to driveways along the south side of Angela. Written notifications will be given to homeowners 24 hours in advance of the driveway closures. Access to driveways will be re-established at the end of the work day.

Work will occur daily between 7 AM- 5 PM in the general vicinity as shown in the attached photo.
